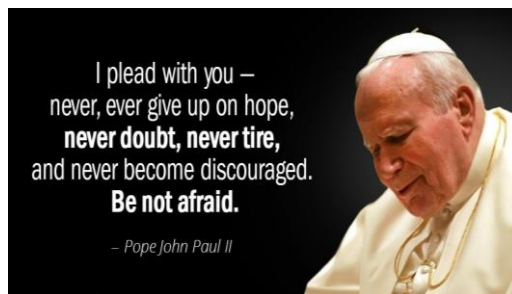


**The Thirtieth Sunday in
