

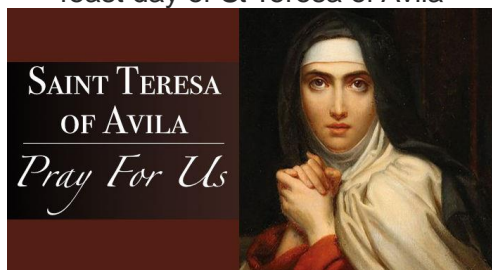

Friday 15th October we celebrate the feast day of St Teresa of Avila

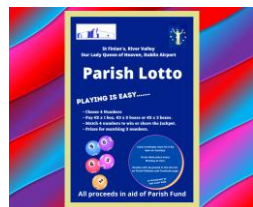
